







Boys & Girls Clubs of West-Central WI – Tomah is looking for 2 AmeriCorps service members for the 2018-2019 school year.

The **Boys & Girls Club's** mission is to enable all young people, especially those who need us most, to reach their full potential as responsible, productive and caring citizens.

Marshfield Clinic Health System AmeriCorps Afterschool - http://marshfieldclinicamericorps.org/

AmeriCorps, often referred to as a domestic Peace Corps, places individuals within communities to spend a year of their life serving others. Marshfield Clinic Center for Community Outreach is a national service grantee that places individuals with afterschool host sites across Northwestern, WI.

Marshfield Clinic Health System AmeriCorps Afterschool program description ~ this program places individuals with afterschool programs throughout northwestern Wisconsin to strengthen programming. Individuals serve as part of a case management team, working directly with at-risk, school-aged children. They provide homework assistance during the school year and organize physical activities and/or provide information on nutrition, personal/social skills or healthy active programming for the enrolled children.

During a typical day of service the member may initially report to the school the youth attend. While at school, the member may supervise a classroom of youth who need additional assistance with homework or other activities. Following the school day, the member reports to the afterschool program site. While there the member may chaperone youth during recreational times, coordinating sports or social activities. They will also provide direct support to the youth they case manage by giving homework assistance, talking with the parents of those youth, or sending updates home about progress being made. Members will build a "portfolio" for each youth, tracking success. The member will also coordinate and complete the youth's enrollment into a database and conduct parent and teacher surveys throughout the year.

Period of Service:

Monday, August 27, 2018 – Monday, September 10 as a short term employee of the Boys & Girls Clubs of West-Central WI for staff training from the Boys & Girls Club.

Tuesday, September 11, 2018 – August 31, 2019 as an AmeriCorps Service Member (End date is negotiable-Early Completion may be negotiated)

Benefits for 2018-2019

- \$528.15 (gross before taxes) bi-weekly payroll for term of service
- Health & Dental Insurance option to enroll with premium paid in full for member only
- Childcare assistance (if qualified)
- \$5,920 education award upon successful completion of the term of service. May be used for self or a child or grandchild.
- Forbearance on qualified student loans and interest accrual payments while serving. (taxable)
- AmeriCorps service gear provided by program. Boys & Girls Club apparel provided by program.

- Work Experience and the development of highly sought job skills (initiative, interpersonal and intercultural communication, adaptability, collaboration and accountability)
- Networking for career placement at all levels of the organization served, with partner organizations and throughout the community. Organizations in the community served often hire members after their term of service because they know what they've invested in the member and what they will be receiving.
- Free Meals while the Boys & Girls Club meal program is active, typically 1 meal and 1 snack per day during the school year and 2 meals & 2 snacks per day during the summer.

Required Orientation & Training (expenses covered):

- September 11 14, 2018
- January 2-4, 2019

What it means to serve in AmeriCorps: Applicants must be willing to serve for the duration of the term of service (1700 hours minimum), averaging approximately 35-40 hours a week. Members must also be able to handle the financial commitment made by accepting the position. Applicants must be 19 years of age by September 11, 2018, possess a high school diploma or GED/HSED, and agree to and pass a criminal and Department of Motor Vehicles background checks. Applicants must be US citizens or Permanent Residents.

Additional Information:

This position will also work closely with one elementary school in Tomah Area School District. This person works with children age 6-11; grades $1^{st} - 5^{th}$. (Middle School could be negotiated.)

Work Hours:

Member will work 32-40 hours per week. This is a flex position. The hours of 2:30 p-7:00 p Monday-Friday are required. The other work hours are flexible but must be done Monday – Friday between the hours of 9:00 am - 2:30 pm. Scheduling outside of those hours must be approved in advance. Member may be asked to work 1 or 2 Saturdays during their service year for a special event

What does a typical day look like?

11:00 – Arrive at the Boys & Girls Club, do case management on targeted children, paperwork 12:30-1:30 – Lunch

1:30 – 2:30 – Work in elementary school in Tomah (will work with same TASD elementary all year)

2:30 – 3:30 – help get children safely from Schools to Club, prep for afternoon programs

3:30 – 5:00 – Assist children with homework

5:00 - 6:00 - Lead a program with group of about 12-18 children. Programs would be either academic enrichment, healthy life skills, or physical activity

6:00 – 7:00 – Assist with healthy snack time, assist children with social skills during play time
